
## The Many Lives of 990 Eurlingame Avenue

Built around 1907, and originally located at Primrose Road and Bellevue Avenue, the structure at 990 Burlingame Avenue has served the Burlingame community in many different capacities. Initially serving as a church, the property was purchased by the City for \$3,000 in 1912 for use as a Public Library. By 1930, voters approved funds for a new, larger library on the site. The American Legion - Burlingame Post No. 163 successfully lobbied the City Council to purchase the older structure for \$1. The cost of moving the building to Washington Park was covered by the SM

County Board of Supervisors. By the late 1970s, the City repossessed the structure, leasing it to the Lions Club for \$1 a year, in exchange for extensive renovations.
