HELIPORT PERMIT

FOR A SPECIAL-USE HELIPORT

Pursuant to California Public Utilities Code, section 21662, the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), Division of Aeronautics, hereby issues this Heliport Permit No. SM-005(H) for the:

This Permit is subject to the following conditions:

1. The heliport is to be maintained in accordance with California Code of Regulations, Title 21, sections 3525 through 3560, and plans dated September 12, 2016, and approved by Caltrans on September 27, 2016.
2. The designated approach/takeoff paths are as follows:
Approach Path: Magnetic bearing of 167°, 301°, and 076°.
Takeoff Path: Magnetic bearing of 347°, 121°, and 256°.
3. The heliport is approved for day and night use.
4. A variance is granted for penetration of the northeastern Federal Aviation Regulation Part 77, 2:1 Transitional Surface by a hospital building and windcone, which are lighted by red obstruction lights.

The physical status of this special-use facility, which was designed to accommodate a helicopter with an overall length of up to 65 feet and a maximum weight of 22,000 pounds, is described below:

- Touchdown and Lift-off Area (TLOF): 65 feet X 65 feet.
- Final Approach and Takeoff Area (FATO): 109 feet in diameter.
- The heliport is lighted.
- The heliport is designed for use by only one helicopter at a time.

This Permit shall remain in effect so long as the heliport meets the conditions under which the Permit was issued or until action is taken by Caltrans to suspend, revoke, or correct the Permit pursuant to the California Public Utilities Code or the California Code of Regulations.

The heliport's owner shall apply to Caltrans for a Corrected Heliport Permit prior to any physical or operational changes at the heliport, which affect the conditions or physical status above, or for a change in heliport ownership.

Failure to maintain the heliport in accordance with the conditions of this Permit is a violation of California Public Utilities Code, section 21666, and is punishable as a misdemeanor.



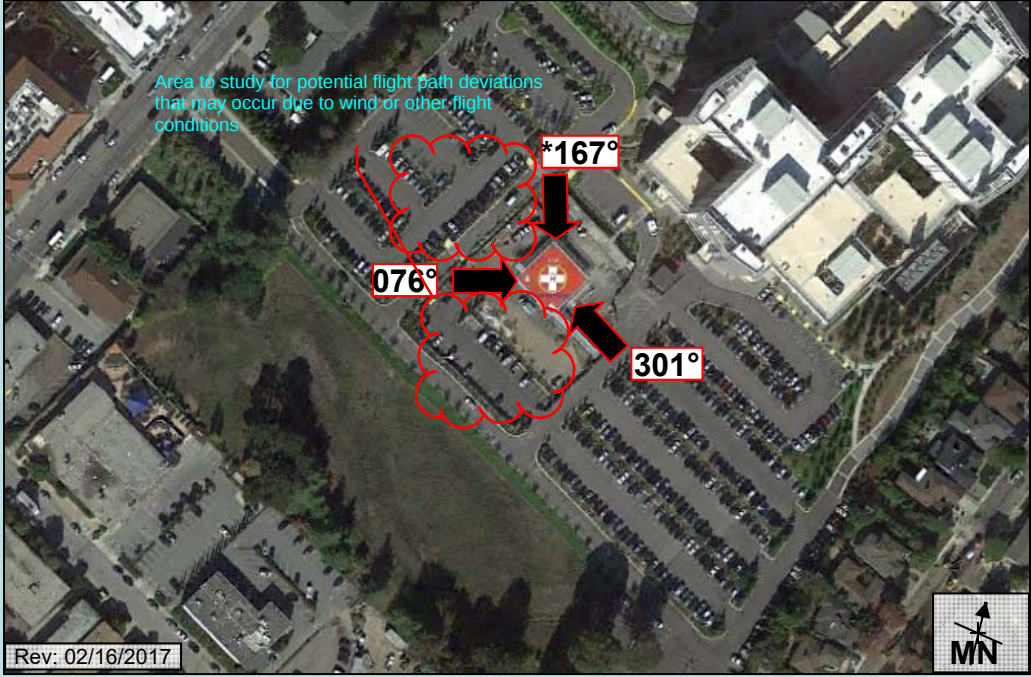
